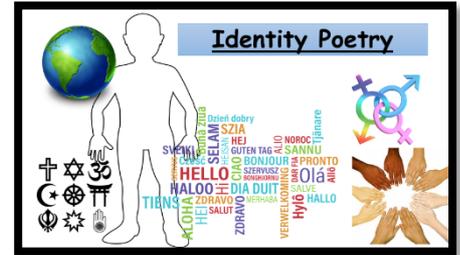




Y7 Topic: Identity Poetry
