

Year 12 Curriculum Plan

Year 12 will complete the study of the Tragedy texts in Cycles 1 and 2, studying Macbeth (Literature Paper 1). After Christmas the focus shifts to exam skills and revision. They will undertake 2 full mocks (all 4 exams in exam conditions): one in November, and one in January. Through March and April, they will sit several guided and exam-style papers. They will revise the Literature texts and Language paper skills.

One essay can be re-creative. The re-creative piece will be accompanied by a commentary.

Prose Text of student's choice
1250-1500 words linking to a different aspect of the Critical Anthology.

Study of Poetry guided by department
1250-1500 words linking to a different aspect of the Critical Anthology.
